"Friday, June 29, 2007. It was a night of firsts at the INN on the Blues - the debut appearance of the Brickyard Blues, the first time that this New Hampshire band, nearly a decade old(!) had performed anywhere in Maine, and the first time most INN-crowders heard the band. And it was all good. Brickyard Blues is Brian James (guitar, vocals, songwriter), Alan Rosen (vocals, songwriter, keyboard), Bernie Rozmovits (bass), Tom Hctor (sax, vocals) and Johann Haas (drums). All together they comprise a high-energy, very tight and very versatile band; and except for Johann (obviously), all the guys are cordless and tend to roam about, joining the dancers as the mood strikes. The INN-crowd loves that up-close and personal showmanship. The INN-crowd soon discovered that, while the band is called Brickyard Blues, they are not solely a blues band, but are much more. The band kept the INN-crowd dancing with their blend of Texas and Chicago blues, a whole lotta soul, R&B and a touch of roots and rockabilly. While Brickyard Blues got acquainted with the INN-crowd, they shared their versions of tunes such as "Chain of Fools", "Right Place, Wrong Time", "Take Me to the River", "Stray Cat Strut", "Unchain My Heart", "Shaky Ground" and "Knock on Wood", and the INN-crowd was hooked. They danced (and sang along with the band) on songs as diverse as Sam & Dave's "Soul Man", ZZ Top's "Sharp-dressed Man" and Johnny Cash's "Folsom Prison Blues". Brickyard Blues also performed original tunes from their terrific 2006 CD "Naughty", including the title song, also "Don't Ask for My Money" and "Alabama Blues Man", their tribute to the late KD Bell, a New England blues favorite. Brickyard Blues will be back at the INN on the Blues in September. Check the schedule - you don't want to miss them; there's something for every musical taste from this talented and personable band - very dance-able and memorable."
